







On May 8-9, Sports Illinois held the Sports Huddle in the Quad Cities. Hosted by the Quad Cities CVB with the participation of 18 CVBs, the conference included sports planners from various organizations—with guest speakers such as Cubs legend Ryne Sandberg—as they convened to discuss the ways sporting events can help drive tourism in Illinois. As a result of the conference, 95% of attendees surveyed said they anticipate having an event that's new or retained in Illinois within two years, a promising sign for the future of sports tourism in our state.

Heart-Cut Whiskey in the Heart of Chicago


Master distiller Robert Birnecker and his wife, Sonat, both left their academic careers behind to found this distillery in the heart of Chicago, but they didn't completely abandon their roots. Robert's Austrian family has been distilling spirits for three generations—a heritage that inspired him to craft organic grain-to-bottle whisk, liqueurs, and specialty spirits made from regionally grown oat, rye, and millet. By avoiding the common industry practice of purchasing premade spirits, **Koval Distillery** supports the local economy and sustainable agriculture, making it a business that exemplifies *Illinois Made*.

Despite the intensely local focus, Koval has made quite a splash in the international whiskey scene. Koval's spirits have won gold medals on both sides of the Atlantic, and distribution now reaches about 25 states as well as Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Japan, Canada, and Australia. The international acclaim may only rise, too, as *Whisky Magazine* recently named Koval one of the top 100 distilleries to visit on the planet.




A MULTICULTURAL PARTY IN SKOKIE


